



Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) 3

- Students in grade 3 must achieve a Level 2 or higher on the ELA Reading PM3 to be promoted to grade 4*
- Passing the Florida
 Assessment for Student Thinking (FAST) for 10th grade Reading is a graduation requirement**



Student Scores

End of Course (EOCs) Assessments

- Students in courses that take an EOC must sit for the exam to complete the course as it equates to 30% of their final grade. This is a standard diploma graduation requirement.
- Passing the Algebra 1 End of Course assessment is a graduation requirement.*
- Students seeking a scholar diploma will also need to sit for and pass specific EOC assessments.

Type of Assessment

Computer adaptive assessment administered through either Renaissance or the state Test Delivery System

Purpose

Measures student mastery of the Benchmarks for Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) standards

Session(s)

Administered in one session ranging from 100-120 minutes

Students may continue working for up to the length of a typical school day, if needed

End of Course Assessments (EOC)

Type of Assessment

Computer-based assessments administered through the state Test Delivery System

Statewide Science Assessment (SSA)

Type of Assessment

Paper-based assessment that is delivered to each school from the Florida Department of Education

Measures student mastery of the Next Generation Sunshine State Standards (NGSSS) in science





Laptops/Tablets

Bring your school-issued device to school on testing days.

Charging

Charge devices to ensure that your child is prepared for testing.



Shut Down

The night before testing, shut down and power off your device.

Power Cords

Bring device power cords to school to keep devices fully charged.

Student Experience



Testing Rules

Students will be read these testing rules during test administration:

- You may not have a cell phone during testing.
- Do not talk to other students or make any disturbance.
- Do not look at another student's test materials.
- Do not ask for or provide help in answering any test questions.
- Use only approved materials for taking notes.
- Do not discuss specific test items after the test. This includes any type of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, or posting to social media sites.

If a student is found with an electronic device or is found using Bluetooth/wireless headphones/earbuds during testing, his or her test will be invalidated.

Electronic Devices

The only device permitted during testing is the school-issued device used to take the assessment.

Students are not permitted to have any other electronic devices, including but not limited to, cell phones, smartphones, tablets, smartwatches, and cameras at any time during testing or during breaks, even if the devices are turned off or students do not use them.

Possession of such devices is cause for invalidation.



Testing Accommodation Tips

Encourage your child to use the accommodations available to them while taking state assessments.
